How the Eclipse Proofreader Treats "Fixed" Paragraph Behavior

The Automated Proofreader first appeared in Eclipse v9, and a little known fact is that it ignores any paragraph that "Behaves As" FIXED. Use this knowledge to adjust your Master Format and avoid tons of "Missing punctuation" highlights on your cover pages, certificate pages, by-line paragraphs, etc.

Do you see all the blue underlining in this example? The underlining will not print nor appear in an ASCII or PDF file, but I do find it a bit annoying. It's just that the Proofreader suspects missing punctuation. Unfortunately,

these lines that should have been set up as "Fixed" paragraphs are using "1 Style" and this user has "1 Style" paragraphs set to behave as "Normal", not "Fixed".

A paragraph that behaves as "Normal" starts with a capital letter and ends with a period or question mark. A paragraph that behaves as "Fixed" does not need a capital letter at the start nor does it need terminal punctuation. That's why "Fixed" paragraph behavior is perfect for the lines of text that state the style of a case since these lines should not each end with a period nor must they each begin with a capital letter.

Many of you are familiar with full-screen mode in Windows. How long has it been since you've used it? Let's give Windows full-screen mode another look and see how it works within Eclipse.

At certain times I find it very useful to see more lines on the screen and like to temporarily ditch the Eclipse toolbar icons at the top of the screen, such as when I am writing real-time during a proceedings. That way I see more of the transcript which is exactly what I'm focused on at that point. I find that having more lines visible is very helpful.

Pressing F11 within Eclipse will maximize your screen real estate. Full-screen mode can enhance your focus and help you see the big picture. Just press the F11 shortcut key to enter full-screen mode. This view makes your Eclipse document fill the whole screen. This also hides all toolbars except for the menu bar at the top and your notes bar and the infobar on the left if you are using them. F11 acts as a toggle between full-screen mode on and off. pressing F11 again exits full-screen mode.

Even the status bar at the bottom of the Eclipse screen is temporarily hidden by fullscreen mode. This is sometimes referred to as You will not see your page and line "autohide." numbers or timecodes at the bottom of your transcript when you are in full-screen mode.


Full-screen mode will maximize the number of lines of your transcript that you see on the screen.



In the next example, the blue highlight after "BY MR. JONES" is because the "By line (SQ)" paragraph "Behaves as" a Question. This By-line paragraph is just stating the questioner; the actual question starts on the next line. That means the By-line paragraph does not

need to end with a question mark. Thus, you could go to User Settings, Paragraphs, select "By line (SQ)" and then use the "Advanced" button. Once the "Advanced paragraph data" dialogue opens, you could pull down the list of choices next to "Behaves as" and select "Fixed". In other words, any paragraph type can take advantage of "Behaves as" FIXED, and that
