
Eclipse v11 Plugins: Find Boundary Problems

Having previously described "Boost Edit", today I want to focus on another powerful plugin: "Find Boundary Problems". It's **designed to help you find potential problems in your dictionary. It then generates a report and suggests how to address the problems.**

Plugins are constantly being developed for Eclipse v11, and you can freely download them from the **Plugin Store** within the Support menu. Then "Manage plugins" shows what you have installed and describes how each plugin is used. In this case it's a utility you can "Run"





whenever you want. Other plugins you may want to "Enable" so they are ready to support a macro or add functions to the menu system each time Eclipse is turned on.

Quickly Inserting the Current Year



This will be a very short tip since I'm overloaded with transcripts at the moment.

Keith shared with me that he recently added a main dictionary entry in order to quickly write the current year. {TM:%Y} The "TM" is referring to time/date, and the "%Y" refers to year. The steno that Keith uses is KWR-RZ. It's a stroke for "years" but it does not use the vowel keys of the

steno keyboard. If you use EclipseVox, you could create a short voice command for this, but it would nonetheless be defined as {TM:%Y}.

At the moment, using that dictionary entry would add "2023" to your translation. Next year it would add "2024". It always inserts the current year, but that's quite helpful since people are often mentioning dates within the current year.

Here's a look at the start of a Boundary Problems Report. I think the examples are helpful. You have a one-stroke entry for "package" (PAPBLG), but that same steno begins several multi-stroke entries like "pajama" (PAPBLG PHA). The second stroke PHA is also the start of several entries like "Marissa" (PHA REUS SA). So if you tried to write "the package Marissa received", you would get something like "the pajama REUS is a received."

The instructions about "How to Read this Report" suggest several approaches for dealing with potential problems.

- You might change the way you write.
- You might remove some entries because they should never have been added in the first place.
- You might decide the problem is not worth addressing because the words are really unlikely to occur together.

I think this is a very useful analysis tool. You might have a large dictionary that you received from someone and you have been adding entries to it over the years. At this point there are lots of entries that you would be surprised to see but they are nonetheless waiting to ambush you.

HOW TO READ THIS REPORT

All entries marked with <---have potentially problematic boundaries.
If you attempt to write (word1) word2 samples,
you will get an incorrect result.

[a one-stroke entry in your dictionary] ----> ROOT: package (PAPBLG)

[A multi-stroke entry starting with PAPBLG]
pajama (PAPBLG PHA) <-----

[All multi-stroke entries starting with PHA]
(package) Marissa (PHA REUS SA)
(package) marathon (PHA RA THOPB)
(package) Maria (PHA RAE KWRA)
(package) marooned (PHA RAOPBD)

[another multi-stroke entry starting with PAPBLG] pagination (PAPBLG TPHAEUGS) <-----

[All multi-stroke entries starting with TPHAEUGS]
(package) NationsBank (TPHAEUGS -S PWAPBG)
(package) nationwide (TPHAEUGS WAOEUD)

If you try to write the root word before the entry with steno indicated in parentheses, that would result in the mistranslation indicated by the arrow.

Examples:

If you wrote "the package Marissa received" you would get "the pajama REUS is a received"


Keith Vincent: Preserving Family Stories
